Sermon Discussion Questions

Note: To give & receive the greatest benefit from this discussion, please review your own sermon notes, read & reflect on these discussion questions in advance.

- 1. What was the last big dilemma you faced or a decision you had to make?
 - a. What things did you do before making that decision? How did it work out?
 - b. Would you generally consider yourself a **decisive** (quickly, little second-guessing) or **indecisive** (like Dr. Seuss's "Zoad in the Road")?
- 2. Someone read **James 1:5-8** and ask others to read the scriptures below.
 - a. In addition to praying for it, which of the listed channels of wisdom do you most often use or neglect?
 - 1) God's Word (pertinent passages) Psalm 119:97-100
 - 2) God's People (wise counselors) Proverbs 15:22
 - 3) God's Spirit (inner promptings) Acts 13:1-3
 - 4) God's Power (ideas or options) Proverbs 3:5-6
 - 5) God's Purpose (bigger picture) Romans 8:28
 - b. Someone suggests a major decision or dilemma (i.e. family, relationships, money, job, church, etc).
 - * Have the group run it through the wisdom channels listed above.
- 3. Someone read James 1:9-11.
 - a. Do you see much economic diversity (haves & have nots) at Bethel?
 - * Has this played any role in tensions over the past few years?
 - b. From this passage & others, how would you counsel someone who is intimidated or resentful of those who have more than they do i.e. **Philippians 4:12-13**.
 - * How would you counsel someone who seems to avoid patronize those who have less than they do i.e. **Matthew 19:23-26**.
- 4. Someone read James 1:12.
 - a. Discuss the differences between Jesus' cross (**Hebrews 12:2**) and our crosses in life (**Matthew 16:24-25**).
 - b. What are some differences between what Simon of Cyrene did (**Luke** 23:26) and what we are challenged to do (**Matthew 10:37-39**)?
 - c. Do you have any thoughts about what the "crown of life" will be for those who persevere under trial?
