
What is your favorite book?


How do we understand Truth in relation to facts? When we look to the Bible for Truth are we looking for facts or THE Truth?


Can we approach the Bible "literally" (which means "by the words") only? Are there other approaches that allow Truth? How do we discern the approach?


How do we translate scripture to life and experience? How does the Bible guide you in loving God and neighbor, and in living a life of faith, hope, and love?
