


SALEM's summer Bible study is about to begin!

"American Pride: Eagles and Stars" Quilts from the Pat and Arlan Christ Collection

The Christs, quilt collectors and historians from Pennsylvania, dedicate their exhibit of patriotic quilts to those who have served in the US military, and their families who remained at home to provide the food, clothing, and materials needed to supply the troops. These creations are a true testament of the "American Pride" that is worked into each stitch.

"Presidential Connections: Quilts, Virginians, and the Whig Party"

Guest Curator: Wayne Harrison

This exhibit presents a series of quilts and other material culture (presidential campaign items) representing the Whig Party or featuring presidents from Virginia. Connections also result through the quilt's pattern or a Virginia quilter who was related to a U.S. president. (Through July 20)

"Treasures from the Vault: The Fallen: Mini Exhibit

This selection of three quilts from the VOM Collection carries the patriotic theme of this Exhibit Phase to a more personal level. Featuring three 9-11 themed guilts, this display was created in memory of our service men and women who have fallen in conflict. Reflect on the names of those who have served, and if you would like, leave a note in memory of a family member or friend who was lost in service to our country.

"Treasures from the Vault: A Ray of Sunshine" Curator: Kate Gallota, VQM Intern

This exhibit features a selection of Depression Era quilts that use the popular patterns and fabrics of the time. Tied together through the yellow in each quilt, the exhibit is named "A Ray of Sunshine", a title that not only represents the bright and cheerful colors, but also the joy that was found in the creation of these pieces despite the trying times of 1930s America. As could be expected, the price of fabrics during the Great Depression was too high for most women to afford, so the trend of using scrap fabric was common. Fabrics came from old clothes, recycled quilts, and even feed and flour sacks.






Summer Adult & Youth Study Fellowship

FIGHTING WORDS By John Piper

"Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand" (Isaiah 41:10)

When I am anxious about some risky new venture or meeting, I battle unbelief with one of my most often-used promises: Isaiah 41:10.

The day I left for three years in Germany, my father called me long distance and gave me this promise on the telephone. For three years, I must have quoted it to myself five hundred times to get me through periods of tremendous stress.

When the motor of my mind is in neutral, the hum of the gears is the sound of Isaiah 41:10.

When I am anxious about my ministry being useless and empty, I fight unbelief with the promise of Isaiah 55:11. "So shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it."

When I am anxious about being too weak to do my work, I battle unbelief with the promise of Christ, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9).

When I am anxious about decisions I have to make about the future, I battle unbelief with the promise, "I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my eye upon you" (Psalm 32:8).

When I am anxious about facing opponents, I battle unbelief with the promise, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Romans 8:31).

When I am anxious about the welfare of those I love, I battle unbelief with the promise that if I, being evil, know how to give good things to my children, how much more will the "Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him!" (Matthew 7:11)?

RAISING SEXUALLY HEALTHY KIDS

In an increasingly sexualized world, it's difficult to know how to teach your children about their sexuality in a godly way. On the one hand, you don't want to give the impression that sex is bad or make them feel ashamed of their bodies. But on the other, you don't want to reinforce the message, "If it feels good, do it." How do you instill a godly view of sexuality into your child without just giving them a list of "don'ts"?
