## **Conversation Questions**

- 1. Have you ever had to deliver hard news to someone? What was it like and how did it go?
- 2. Read Jonah chapter 3. What verse or phrase stands out to you most? Why?
- 3. What do you observe about God in this story? We see that God is angry. What is he angry about (v. 8) and how is his anger different than ours?
- 4. How do the Ninevites and their king respond to Jonah's message? "Repentance" means "turning back" to God. What do we learn about repentance from the Ninevites and their king?
- 5. The Ninevites responded to Jonah's message of judgment with repentance. They "believed God." (v.5) When you hear about God's judgment how do you tend to respond? (Anger? Cynicism? Disbelief? Mockery? Fear?) Is there anything in your life that you know is displeasing to God but have not repented? Look at how God responds: Whenever we repent, God relents. (v.10) Is there anything you're ready to confess to God and begin changing?
- 6. Jonah's repentance in chapter 2, resulted in others experiencing God's mercy as well. Pastor Porter said, "As we experience mercy and repentance, others around us will experience repentance as well..." Who should be experiencing forgiveness from you this week? Be specific.
- 7. Pray and ask God to help you to change. Ask him to help you extend his mercy to others this week.
