Conversation Questions

1. What misconceptions about marriage, dating and singleness did you have when you were a teenager? Describe your ideal at that time.
2. *Read 1 Corinthians 7:25-40. What verse or phrase stands out to you most? Why?
3. *In this section Paul speaks to people who are betrothed (engaged), single, married and widowed. What advice does he give to each group?
4. How do you think Paul's teaching would help us to be "free from anxieties" (v.32)?
5. Paul's teaching about marriage and singleness is given in the context of the coming kingdom of God (v.19-21). How do you think that a clear understanding of the kingdom of God promote "good order" and "undivided devotion to the Lord" in our marriages, dating and singleness (v.35)?
6. How would you like your relationships to change in light of Paul's teaching?
7. Give thanks for the gifts of marriage and singleness and ask God for help to live with "undivided devotion to the Lord."
