Conversation Questions

- 1. What pearls of wisdom or values did your parents pass on to you that have impacted your life?
- 2. Read Matthew 5:13-16. What verse or phrase stands out to you most? Why?
- 3. What kinds of things come to mind when you hear Jesus saying that his disciples are the "salt of the earth" (v.13)? (The 'you' in these verses are all plural so he's speaking to the disciples as a community, not just individuals.) What do you think Jesus is trying to communicate about who we are and what we're supposed to be like?
- 4. What kinds of things come to mind when you hear Jesus say that we are "the light of the world" (v.14)?
- 5. Jesus says that salt can lose its saltiness and light can be hidden. How do Christian communities lose their saltiness and hide their light today? Is there any specific way that your community is doing this right now that you need to pay attention to?

Take some time to give thanks for God's promise that we are salt and light. Ask for His help to grow together in saltiness and brightness.
