Conversation Questions

1. Is there anything that your parents encouraged you to try or experience when you were a kid? You were afraid to try it, but when you did it was pretty awesome. Share the story.
2. Read 1 Corinthians 15:35-49. What words or phrases stand out to you? Why?
3. In verses 36-41 Paul talks about the resurrection using the analogy of a seed that is sown into the ground and the plant that grows up from it. Then in verses 42 he says "So it is with the resurrection of the dead..."
 - a. What does the analogy of a seed show us about the resurrection?
 - b. Is this an encouraging picture of what the resurrection will be like? Why or why not?
4. Paul's point seems to be: "There will be a connection between our present reality and our future glory, but the glory of the resurrection will outstrip our present glory like the glory of heavenly bodies outstrips the glory of earthly bodies."
 - a. If you knew your future would be this glorious, how would it help you to face adversity today?
 - b. How would it change your priorities in life?
 - c. How would it impact how you view other people?
5. Is there anything in this passage that you know God is speaking to you about?
 - a. Is there any attitude that you know you need to change?
 - b. Any promise that you know you need to trust in?
 - c. Any specific sin that you know you need to confess?
