*QUESTIONS FOR KIDS! Questions most suitable for children are marked with an asterisk.

1. Have you ever let someone down and they stuck with you anyway? Have you ever experienced an unconditional commitment from someone?
2. Read Philippians 1:3-11. What verse or phrase stands out to you most? Why?
3. Make a list of Paul's feelings and attitudes toward the Philippians. Which do you love most? Make a list of where do you see his unconditional commitment being expressed most clearly?
4. How do you think the Philippians benefitted from Paul's unconditional love for them? How do you think their faith was strengthened by this?
5. What is Paul's hope for the Philippian church anchored in (v.6,7)? How do you think this is different from what our hope for the church is sometimes anchored in?

7. Do you ever struggle with hopelessness for the church or for yourself? Are there any promises or truths in this passage that would help you to have hope? Please be specific.

6. What does Paul teach about how Jesus feels about us (v.8)?

Take some time to thank God for your church and for God's commitment to it and to you. Ask for grace to love God's people unconditionally. Identify an individual in the church that you need a new attitude toward. Share that with God and ask for his help.
