#### The Ongoing Reformation

"Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ."

### Romans 5:1

Is God angry? That may seem like an odd question but consider it for a moment. Is God angry? Some other religions and even some Christian denominations have a tendency to view God as an angry judge, sitting on a throne, and frowning all the time. They portray God as if He is eternally grumpy, uncomfortable and mad. Why could God be angry? When we get angry, there is usually a reason. We usually aren't grumpy, mad, or angry for no reason. God is the same way.

Every Sunday during worship at both services we say words during the confession of sins. Because we say these words and confess our sins every week, we may overlook exactly how significant they really are.

Is God "mad"? Yes. God is. He is mad at all the "sins and iniquities" we have offended Him with. He is mad at the "sins and iniquities" that we KEEP offending Him with time and time again.

What is fascinating about God though is this: He doesn't just sit around on a throne being mad and grumpy. God is indeed mad at our sins... and He is so mad that He did something about it! God the Father sent Jesus Christ to suffer and die in our place, for all our sins. He sent Jesus to be sacrificed for every single one of those "sins and iniquities" we have ever done so that God will NEVER have to be mad at any of us ever again.

Our passage above from Romans 5:1 says, *"Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ."* We have peace with God because of Jesus Christ. We don't have peace with God because we tried really hard not to sin (and still sinned anyway), we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. We do NOT have peace with God because we somehow suffered and were punished enough to make up for our sins and iniquities we have done (we could never suffer enough) instead, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

As we prepare to celebrate the 502nd Anniversary of the Reformation this month, I pray we will ALWAYS remember that we only have peace with God because of our Lord Jesus Christ who suffered and died for us on a cross. Jesus has made peace between you and God the Father. Never let anyone take this eternal treasure away from you. Don't let other religions sweet talk this heavenly teaching away from you. Don't let other Christian denominations try to seduce you into believing another teaching. And never allow your own sinful nature to deceive you into believing that Jesus somehow failed to cover all of your sins; His blood covers ALL sins. By God's great mercy, love, and favor you do have peace with God. You have peace with God the Father thanks to our Lord Jesus Christ and Him alone.

#### Music Ministry News

#### Colin R.A. Eversley, Minister of Music

The choir has made great musical strides this past year. During that time, choir membership was at an all-time high of 13. Unfortunately, we lost some members for various reasons, including health and geographical relocation. However, the 7 core members have remained faithful and steadfast. Each year, the choir strives to increase its diversity through music. During 2018-19, more solos were performed, highlighting the individual talents of our members, including; our most challenging accomplishment, Christmas excerpts from Handel's Messiah. Our most enjoyable experience was combining our voices with the children to sing "All the Way to Calvary" on Palm Sunday.

In contrast to past years, I have chosen all the music for both services which has resulted in increased congregational participation. I will slowly continue to incorporate unknown or unfamiliar hymns to both services, thus increasing the congregation's musical repertoire that should be known to all Lutheran's. The hymns are taken directly from Lutheran hymnals: Lutheran Book of Worship [Green Book], With One Voice [WOV-Blue Book], This Far By Faith [TFBF-Red Book], The Best of the Best [BOB], and the occasional CCLI choices, a licensing music source.

For the remainder of 2019, and looking forward to 2020, the choir will endeavor to lead the congregation through music while enhancing worship service through song. The past season of music at Hope was filled with change and a bright glimpse towards future growth. The introduction of ONE service was well received. The "Order of Worship" was alternated between traditional and contemporary formats. Most noticeable, was the increased congregational attendance. Hopefully, the attendance will continue to grow as God leads us in that direction.

I am very proud of the choir's accomplishments. This year our goal is service. We want to serve and sponsor events, as well as increase membership. Beginning on October 20, 2019, the choir will host the after-service Coffee Hour. We have some other ideas in the planning stages, including visiting choirs, guest soloists, and guest musicians.

Working with Pastor Meheret has truly been a blessing. She has allowed me to grow as a musician and church leader. As this year comes to completion, we cannot be stagnating, but continue to spread the Gospel through word and voice. The choir will continue to spread its mission of "Singing to the glory of God". It will take ALL of us to continue to grow the church through stewardship and worship.

Let us continue to give God the glory for the great things he hast done!






