From the Pastor

"Christmas for the Unworthy"

"And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. [...] The angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people."" – Luke 2:8 & 10

They smelled funny. Their clothes were not the most fashionable. When given the choice as to whether or not to spend time with them, most people would have cho-

sen not to. And yet despite their reputation, the shepherds were the first guests called to the side of the bedside of the Messiah. It was not kings who were heralded by angels to go to meet Jesus. It was not to the wealthy of Bethlehem that tidings of great joy were first brought to. It was to the shepherds.

One of the most unique aspects of the nativity story is the fact that God calls the seemingly most "unworthy" people to be the ones to welcome His Son into the world. From calling a peasant, teenage and betrothed girl named Mary to be Jesus mother to a carpenter to serve as His earthly father, to the shepherds to be His first proclaimers, we find God calling the "unworthy" to be the "worthy".

So what does this teach us? First of all, it teaches us something about God's heart for people. God does not judge people by earthly standards. He judges according to His heart for all people. This includes both the rich and the poor, the accepted and rejected. If you notice in verse 10 of Luke chapter 2 the angels make this abundantly clear declaring, "Do not be afraid! I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people." The news of Christ, and the joy, which accompanies it is for all people.

The second thing we learn is the reason why God would choose to call the rejected by society to be the first ones brought to the side of the Savior of the World. The reason also comes to us from verse 10 and is seen in the phrase, "Do not be afraid." We know from verse 9 that the shepherds were terrified by the sudden appearance of angels, and so it makes sense that the angels would try to calm those fears. And yet I also believe it was given so that they would know that the message the angels brought was indeed for them. Like the rest of their society the shepherds would probably not have thought themselves likely candidates for the invitation. Do not be afraid, don't worry, this news really is for you. By starting with those the world rejected God declared His intention to serve ALL people.

So where does that leave us this Advent and Christmas season? It leaves us with a call to view Christmas through the same eyes as God. Every day we make judgments regarding other people, sometimes we are right in those judgments and sometimes not. And yet the reality is on our own, all people, each and every one of us is unworthy of what Christmas brings. For each of us is in a constant war with the reality of sin in our lives, and that sin makes us unworthy. This truth should make the invitation to the shepherds all the more real for each of us. For when we witness God's invitation to the unworthy shepherds, we can also hear our own invitation.

The message to the shepherds is the message to you, me and all people. "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy for all people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord." Christmas is for the unworthy, for the one born makes us worthy.


