

Bishop Gohl's 2025 Easter Message The Rev. William (Bill) Gohl, Jr., Bishop Delaware-Maryland Synod, ELCA

But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. –Luke 24.11

Our Easter joy doesn't simply come from an empty grave; real Easter joy comes from the faith we have in the promises attached to that empty grave. Promises like: it is no idle tale, Jesus is risen, and you will rise, too.

It is no idle tale, Jesus is risen, and you will rise, too. That's Easter, not a cold empty tomb but the rich promises of God that there is no burden too great, no place too lonely, no faith in Christ that is vainly kept. Our Easter joy is grounded not so much in our faith or faithfulness, but in the faithfulness of our God who keeps their promises.

Today is not about pasting on a smile, or covering up old wounds or festering hurts – and it's certainly not about hiding what's real in our lives from God – God knows our griefs, to our struggles and burdens, God is no stranger. Easter is not about hiding – it's about healing, the healing

and precious promise that it is no idle tale, Jesus is risen, and you will rise, too.



And so, to the dear ones who are experiencing their first, or fifth or twenty-fifth Easter missing beloved parents, partners, spouses, children, friends and family; to those who are experiencing the loss of work or security, who know something of the grief to which the scripture speaks today, it is no idle tale, Jesus is risen, and you will rise, too.

To the dear ones whose beloveds have not kept their promises, even as you have kept yours; for you whose children, grandchildren, or friends are far off – relationally or geographically; or whose relationships have been less than what you hoped for, prayed for, or expected, it is no idle tale, Jesus is risen, and you will rise, too.

To the dear ones who are burdened by stress at work, stress at home, debt, addiction, bad decisions; whose bodies betray them – or who watch sadly as a loved one's body runs down, it is no idle tale, Jesus is risen, and you will rise, too.

To the dear ones who are terrified by the fear of loss, who feel their hard-fought rights being stripped away, who struggle with the silence and complicity of neighbors; to those who are tired, weak and worn-out by the state of our community, the nation, and the world, it is no idle tale, Jesus is risen, and you will rise, too.

To the dear ones who have experienced casual prejudice, overt racism, institutionalized transphopia, government-sanctioned xenophobia, homophobia-disguised-as-humor; who know the trauma of assault or abuse; who've experienced not having been believed like the women in Luke's Easter gospel, whose love has been run down with loose words and cheap criticism; and particularly to those who have been hurt by the church, it is no idle tale, Jesus is risen, and you will rise, too.

Dear ones, all: we who carry this precious gift of faith, no matter how great or small that faith might feel or be; God blesses and sends us this Easter, to be credible witnesses; in word and deed; willing to risk anything, perhaps even everything; to bring healing, hope, and resurrection in ways that we've never done it before; together, for the sake of a world God still so loves, in Jesus Christ.

Indeed, it is no idle tale, Jesus is risen, and you will rise, too.

Alleluia.








IMPORTANT FOOD FOR THOUGHT NEWS!
