

Atlanta Mission Trip 2022 Information Sheet

Ingleside Middle School Ministry (6th – 8th grade students) will be going to Atlanta, Georgia, **Saturday, July 16** – **Thursday, July 21, 2022**. This trip is a partnership with Send Relief, which is a collaboration between the International Mission Board and North American Mission Board. We will be ministering to individuals in Clarkston, a suburb of Atlanta, which is one of the most diverse communities in America. Nearly 70% of the population is foreign-born, and there are more than 50 countries and more than 100 distinct ethnic groups represented within 1.4 square miles. We will be partnering with the Send Relief Ministry Center in Clarkston and students will have opportunities for refugee ministry as well as various ministry outreach projects throughout the Atlanta metro area.

- The cost is \$425 and includes all transportation, most meals, supplies, and lodging.
- Space is limited to the first 8 male students and 8 female students who register online and submit an approved Missions Application.
- Requirements:
 - Member of Ingleside Baptist Church, age 12 or older at time of the trip
 - Approved Student Mission Application (located at ingleside.org/go)
 - Attendance of the Ingleside Missions Orientation (If a student has already attended the class, they do not need to attend again.)
 - A condensed student edition of the Missions Orientation will be offered on Sunday, March 6, 2:00-3:45 p.m.
 - Attendance of 3 out of the 4 team training meetings:
 - Sunday, April 3, 12:15 2:00 p.m.
 - Sunday, April 24, 12:15 2:00 p.m.
 - Sunday, May 15, 12:15 2:00 p.m.
 - Sunday, May 22, 2:00 4:00 p.m.

Atlanta Mission Trip FAQs July 16-21, 2022

Why should my student go on a mission trip?

In order to help students be faithful followers of Jesus, we provide opportunities for them to come to worship, grow in a group, serve in the body, and go with the gospel. This trip is one way for students to live out an important part of discipleship (Matthew 28:19-20, Acts 1:8). Your student will be stretched spiritually, physically, and emotionally but will experience God's wider work in the world. It opens them up to see the needs of people outside their community and may even open the gate to further missions work later in life.

What's the first step for my student to be involved in this trip?

The first step is to register your student online at ingleside.org/register and pay the \$75 deposit. Next, have your student fill out a Student Missions Application themselves. These are available online at ingleside.org/go.

Who is this trip for?

This trip is open to all Middle School students in grades 6 - 8, over the age of twelve, who can demonstrate a testimony of faith in Christ and fulfill the requirements listed on the front page.

Can my student recruit a guest outside of Ingleside to go?

No. All of our Ingleside mission trips require participants to be active members of our local fellowship.

Who is leading this trip?

Wil Fason, our Middle School Pastor, will be the key leader for the mission trip. Anna Leigh Hutcheson, our Middle School Associate, will help lead the trip alongside 2 – 3 other adult leaders.

Where will the group stay?

Lodging is provided at the Send Relief Ministry Center in Clarkston. Accommodations are gender-separated. Students will bring their own linens or sleeping bag, pillow, towels, and toiletries.

What does \$425 cover?

The cost of this trip covers transportation, most food, lodging, a t-shirt, and ministry supplies. We have worked hard to make this as affordable a trip as possible by supplementing the cost significantly through the Middle School Ministry budget. In the Missions Orientation, your student will learn about approved ways of raising financial support through inviting others to give toward the mission of sharing Christ in Clarkston and Atlanta.
