Enter into this time expectantly, knowing that God delights to reveal himself to you and your family. Use this devotional as you are able, in whole or in part.

OPENING PRAYER

Direct us, O Lord, in all our doings with your most gracious favor, and advance us with your continual help; that in all our works begun, continued, and ended in you, we may glorify your holy Name, and finally, by your mercy, obtain everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. (BCP 832)
