From The Episcopal Church on the Season of Creation

The Season of Creation, September 1st through October 4th, is celebrated by Christians around the world as a time for renewing, repairing and restoring our relationship to God, one another, and all of creation. The Episcopal Church joins this international effort for prayer and action for climate justice and an end to environmental racism and ecological destruction. The 2023 theme is *Let Justice and Peace Flow*.



In celebrating the Season, we are invited to consider anew our ecological, economic, and political ways of living. The Episcopal Diocese of Maryland joins sixteen other dioceses in authorizing the use of curated liturgical resources for Episcopal parishes from which the contemporary readings are chosen.

Note: this service begins outside the church building in the Memorial Garden.

As part of our observance of the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, whose call to ministry began outdoors as he felt God call him to "rebuild his church," so too will we begin our next chapter of ministry outdoors.

After today's service during Fellowship Hour, the St. Francis Community Agreements will be signed by all who feel called to make this commitment to our shared life here.

For those unable to join in the garden and process indoors, you are welcome to begin inside the sanctuary, where the outdoor portion of the service will be livestreamed.

Presider You called us to tend the land.


All Yet we have polluted it. Help us to clean up your creation.



On the night before he died for us, Our Savior Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said:

"Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said:

"Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Remembering his death and resurrection, we now present to you from your creation this bread and this wine. By your Holy Spirit may they be for us the Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus Christ. "Let Justice and Peace Flow" is the theme chosen for Season of Creation 2023, the ecumenical celebration we hold each year from September 1, World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, to October 4th, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi.

The prophet Amos cries out, "But let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream!" (Amos 5:24), and so we are called to join the river of justice and peace, to embrace climate and ecological justice, and to speak out with and for communities that are most impacted by climate injustice and biodiversity loss.

Our prayers must call for justice not only for human beings, but for all creation. In covenant with peace, we are called to repent of our ecological sins and to change our attitudes and actions.



"A mighty river" is the symbol chosen to go with this theme, representing biodiversity at risk. The urgency is growing and we must make peace with the Earth and on the Earth visible, while justice calls us to repentance and a change of attitude and actions. When we join the river of justice and peace with others, it creates hope instead of despair.

We are invited to join the river of justice and peace on behalf of all Creation and to converge our individual identities, of name, family or faith community, in this greater movement for justice, just as tributaries come together to form a mighty river.

Prophet Isaiah proclaims "Listen carefully, I am about to do a new thing, now it will spring forth; will you not be aware of it? I will even put a road in the wilderness, rivers in the desert." (Isaiah 43:<u>A</u>19)



Information about Land Acknowledgements from The Episcopal Church office of Indigenous Ministries:



At the 80th General Convention (2022), two resolutions were passed regarding the inclusion of Indigenous land acknowledgements in our corporate life and worship.

Resolution C072 reads as follows:

Resolved, that The Episcopal Church commits to ensuring that all public gatherings and worship of The Episcopal Church, its boards, commissions, committees of the same, will, before the 81st General Convention, implement land acknowledgement liturgies and prayers to begin any public meetings or worship held in North America...

Resolution D019 reads as follows:

Resolved, that the 80th General Convention shall promote the acknowledgement of Indigenous Lands at all gatherings within the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society (TEC) and its affiliate organizations...

In response to these resolutions, many congregations, dioceses, and other church groups and organizations have begun the practice of making land acknowledgements regarding the Indigenous tribal people who used to live on the land they currently occupy, and in some cases still do.

A land acknowledgement is not:

- A statement intended to make everyone feel guilty and ashamed.
- A one-and-done task that gets everyone "off the hook."
- A call to vacate our homes and return overseas to the land of our ancestors.

A land acknowledgement is:

- Truth-telling about what happened in our homeland years ago and how it affects the way we live today.
- A recognition of the Indigenous tribal people whose home was the land we now occupy. By
 doing so we remember them and begin to ask questions about what happened to them and
 why.
- An invitation to right relationship with Indigenous tribal people, particularly if the people still reside in the region. A recognition that Indigenous people currently live in all areas of this country, even if we do not see them. They are still here.
